Blueberries are self-fertile, but for best pollination, plant more than one cultivar. Blueberry plants should be spaced in a row about 4 to 5 feet apart; adjacent rows should be spaced 9 to 10 feet apart, which will provide plenty of room for harvesting.

Blueberry Kisses has a different growth habit to Blueberry Burst from the beginning and the bush is not as compact as Blueberry Burst in the first year. If Blueberry Kisses sends a shoot up one side of the the plant which potentially looks like it will overtake the bush in the first year this shoot should be pruned back level with the rest of the bush.

How to grow blueberries in a garden. Choose a sunny spot with well drained soil. Enrich the soil with Yates Dynamic Lifter Soil Improver & Plant Fertiliser.
