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Objective To update the 2001 American Academy of Neurology (AAN) guideline on mild cognitive impairment (MCI). Methods The guideline panel systematically reviewed MCI prevalence, prognosis, and treatment articles according to AAN evidence classification criteria, and based recommendations on evidence and modified Delphi consensus. Results MCI prevalence was 6.7% for ages 60–64, 8.4% for 65 ...

This guideline provides recommendations for the recognition, diagnosis and management of cognitive impairment in adults \geq 19 years within the primary care setting. The guideline focuses on Alzheimer's disease, the most common form of dementia seen in primary care.
