Complex Regional Pain Syndrome (CRPS), formerly referred to as Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy or RSD, is a rare disorder that causes spontaneous and disproportionately intense pain in response to a sensory stimulus. For example, a light touch of skin which is otherwise painless can cause extreme and lasting pain in patients with CRPS.

Response to treatment of RSD is greater in the earlier stages of the condition than in the later stages. Cool, moist applications to the affected areas can provide some relief of burning symptoms. While there is no cure for CRPS (which used to be called reflex sympathetic dystrophy—RSD), there are a number of treatments. Your doctor will most likely refer you to a physical therapist and a psychological counselor, as well as administer or prescribe pain medications for CRPS. Physical Therapy for CRPS/RSD

Evidence for sympathetic nerve blocks generally is insufficient to support their use. Intramuscular botulinum injections may benefit people with symptoms localized to one extremity. Ketamine. Ketamine, a dissociative anesthetic, appears promising as a treatment for CRPS. It may be used in low doses if other treatments have not worked.

Updates in Management Of Complex Regional Pain Syndrome

CRPS is subdivided into 2 categories: type I and type II CRPS. In CRPS type I, there are no nerve injuries or lesions identified. CRPS type I is also known as “reflex sympathetic dystrophy,” and it comprises about 90 percent of all cases of CRPS. CRPS type II (causalgia), on the other hand, is diagnosed when there is evidence of nerve damage.
