Namibia has the second largest population of white rhinos in the world after South Africa and, according to NGO Save the Rhino, it holds one-third of the world's remaining black rhinos. Rhino poaching in Namibia has fluctuated over the years - from 95 in 2015 to to 60 in 2016, 36 in 2017 and 72 in 2018.

Namibia's substantial rhino populations have unfortunately attracted organized poaching syndicates. To counteract increased poaching in 2014 and 2015, the government and its partners mobilized funding from GPTF and other sources to strengthen and coordinate their anti-poaching efforts. Consequently, black rhino poaching declined by 33% during the past three years.
