The term Goods in Transit (or Transit inventory) refers to inventory items that have been shipped by the seller, but not yet received by the buyer. Transit inventory is an important component of company's inventory valuation.

Goods in Transit or Transit Inventory

Goods in Transit refers to the goods that is left the shipping dock of the seller, but not yet reached the receiving dock of the buyer. Goods in transit concept is used to indicate whether the buyer or seller of goods has taken possession, and who is paying for transport.

Accounting Treatment of Goods in Transit. - Accountant Skills

The transshipment and transit of goods through Singapore are regulated under the Customs Act, the Regulation of Imports and Exports Act, the Strategic Goods (Control) Act, and other legislations enforced by the relevant Competent Authorities. The transshipment of all goods is not subject to duty or Goods and Services Tax (GST).

Transshipment Procedures

"Transit transport" means transit of goods and means of transport across the territory of one or more Contracting Parties, when the passage across such territory or territories, with or without transshipment, warehousing, breaking bulk or change in the mode of transport, is only a portion of a complete journey beginning and terminating beyond the frontier of one or more Contracting Parties ...

Customs transit is a customs procedure used to move goods. between two points of a customs territory, via another customs territory; or; between two or more different customs territories. Using the Customs Transit procedure allows for the temporary suspension of duties, taxes and commercial policy measures that are applicable at import.

Transit Procedures. Transit procedures facilitate the free movement of goods through the EU and third countries, by temporarily suspending duties and charges until they reach their final destination. There are three types of transit procedures. Community Transit applies to movement of goods within the EU territories only.

So the cost of good in transit is equal to \$1,027 per container. If you have 50 containers shipment per month; your monthly cost of goods of transit is equal to $\$1,027 \times 50 = \$51,350$.
